

ORAL HISTORY PARTICIPATION AND RECORDING AGREEMENT

The purpose of this form is to explain how the recorded interview which you agree to undertake with us is archived digitally on the secure platform UCloud (<https://docs.cloud.sdu.dk/intro/security.html>). When you sign this form, you are agreeing to take part in the interview and allowing us to store and make use of your personal data now and in the future in order to administer and archive your interview.

You have been invited to take part in the *From antiquity to community: rethinking classical heritage through citizen humanities* (AntCom) oral history project, which documents the role of classical heritage in building modern, plural, diverse European identities. The project will reconstitute heritage back to communities and build more complete, sustainable narratives and memory practices about Europe's classical past.

Your recorded interview will become part of the AntCom UCloud archive, where it will be preserved as a permanent public reference resource for use in research, publication, education, lectures, broadcasting, and internet access.

The purpose of this Agreement is to ensure that your contribution is added to AntCom UCloud archive in strict accordance with your wishes. The information contained within the interview itself will be made available (subject to your agreement) to researchers, academics and other members of the public who access oral history content. We will keep this data in perpetuity, so as to preserve the AntCom oral history project and inform the research of future generations.

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation - GDPR) and Italian law.

INFORMATION ON PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING

In accordance with art. 13 – EU Regulation n. 2016/679 (in the following, GDPR), we inform you that the current legislation on data protection, with particular regard to the field of historical research (EU Regulation 2016/679 on the protection of personal data - GDPR, Legislative Decree no. 196/2003 “Code on the subject of protection of personal data” as amended by Legislative Decree 101/2018, the “Ethical rules for processing for archiving purposes in the public interest or for historical research purposes”, as well as the various Prescriptions of the Italian Guarantor on the matter) establishes the right of every person to the protection of personal data. In accordance with the aforementioned legislation, the processing of your personal data in the context of the AntCom oral history project will be based on compliance with the principles set out in art. 5 of the GDPR.

Data holder

The holder of the data processing is AntCom (Campusvej 55, 5230 Odense M, DK)

Object of the data processing

The data holder processes personal data (i.e. name, surname, address, telephone, email, etc.) – in the following, “personal data” or “data” – communicated by you to the data holder to participate in AntCom oral history project.

Purpose of the data processing

The purpose of the data processing is related to the implementation of the AntCom oral history project.

Legal basis of the data processing

Processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller or by a third party, except where such interests are overridden by the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject which require protection of personal data: art. 6, (1) (f) of the GDPR. The processing of special categories of personal data is necessary for archiving purposes in the public interest and historical research purposes and will be proportionate to the aim pursued, will respect the essence of the right to data protection and will provide for suitable and specific measures to safeguard the fundamental rights and the interests of the data subject: art. 9, par. 2, lit. j) of the GDPR.

In any case, art. 8 of the “Ethical rules for processing for archiving purposes in the public interest or for historical research purposes” requires explicit consent as a protective measure for the data subject.

Method and duration of the data processing

Your data will be collected in accordance with “Good Practices in Oral History”, approved by AISO (Associazione Italiana di Storia Orale). The processing of your data takes place following the operations as reported in art. 4, (2) of the GDPR and, precisely: collection, registration, organization, storage, consultation, elaboration, modification, selection, extraction, comparison, use, interconnection, interruption, communication, deletion, and destruction of data. Your personal data are processed both on paper and electronically / on automatic systems adopting the following security measures: if necessary, pseudonymisation or muting of certain parts of the recording, limited to the copy of the audio document made available; or deletion of certain parts of the transcript, limited to the copy made available. Your personal data will only be processed by authorised persons in the context of the AntCom oral history project.

The data holder will process personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the scopes as mentioned above, and retained for historical research purposes even beyond the period

necessary to achieve the purposes for which they were collected and may subsequently be processed pursuant to Article 5(1)(e) of the GDPR.

Nature of the provision of data and consequences of refusal to respond

The provision of required data is necessary for the correct implementation of the activities carried out by the data holder, and for the effective management of the AntCom oral history project. The failure to provide the required data will make it impossible for you to participate.

Access to data and communication of the data

Your personal data may be disclosed to researchers for clearly determined scientific purposes and if necessary, in anonymous or pseudonymised form.

Disclosure of results

Your personal data may be disclosed (e.g. through the publication of scientific articles and/or the creation of databases, including in open access mode, participation in conferences, etc.) only if relevant and indispensable to the research and if they do not violate your privacy and confidentiality.

Rights of the interested party

The interested party has the right to obtain by the data holder, the confirmation that data processing referred to him/her is taking place and, in such a case, s/he has the right to have access to personal data, to correct or cancel them, or limit the processing. Furthermore, s/he has the right of portability, of revoking his/her consent anytime, without prejudice to the lawfulness of the processing based on consent before the revocation, and of proposing a complaint to a supervisory authority.

Modalities to exercise the rights
